# **SCHOOL KITS**

We also, of course, are happy to receive monetary donations toward the purchase of items (checks should be made payable to First Lutheran Church and noted for "School Kits").

Items should be placed in the designated containers located in the High Street narthex and in the hall-way near the church office by Friday, September 6. Please make sure the items do not have patriotic or religious symbols on them.

- > 70-sheet notebooks of wide—or college-ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 1/2"; no loose-leaf paper
- ➤ 30-centimeter rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- > pencil sharpeners
- blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- > unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- ➤ 2 1/2" erasers



# FINE ARTS AT FIRST 2019-2020 SERIES

JOHN BULLARD, Classical Banjo Sunday, October 20, 2019 at 3:00 p.m.



As a classically-trained musician, John Bullard is the first graduate of Virginia Commonwealth University's Department of Music to earn a degree in performance with the banjo. He has established a critically praised performing and recording career dedicated to exploring the artistic marriage of banjo and classical music. Although most people think of the banjo as a folk and bluegrass instrument, Bullard is introducing the classical banjo to a growing audience worldwide through three album-length recordings, live performances, and workshops. His concert repertoire includes solo, duet, and quartet performances of the works of Bach, Vivaldi, Handel, and others of the Baroque Period along with later period pieces by Schumann and others. More recently Bullard has begun featuring new works by contemporary American composers. He will be joined for part of the concert on organ and piano by David Erickson, cantor of First Evangelical Lutheran Church.

THOMAS GAYNOR, Organ Sunday, November 17, 2019 at 3:00 p.m.



In July 2017, New Zealand-born organist Thomas Gaynor was awarded the First Prize in Organ interpretation as well as the Audience Prize at the St. Albans International Organ Competition - the 25th organist and the second New Zealander to receive this distinction since the competition and festival was founded in 1963. He is rapidly making his mark on the organ scene in both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres with rock-solid playing and remarkable musical élan. Mr. Gaynor is a doctoral candidate at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, and a recipient of Eastman's highly coveted Artist Diploma. The recital will feature something for everyone and will showcase the majesty and versatility of the church's 1951 Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ, regarded as one of the finest instruments in South Central Pennsylvania.

Thomas Gaynor's concert will be held as a benefit for **The Arc of Cumberland and Perry Counties (CPARC)**. Based in Carlisle, its mission is to provide support, training, and opportunities to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families.

#### WESTMINSTER KANTOREI


Sunday, March 1, 2020 at 4:00 p.m.



Westminster Kantorei is an auditioned vocal chamber choir specializing in early and contemporary music at Westminster Choir College of Rider University in Princeton, New Jersey. The college is one of the world's leading schools of music located on a 23-acre campus in the heart of Princeton, New Jersey. Conducted by Amanda Quist, chair of the Conducting, Organ, and Sacred Music Department, the award-winning early music ensemble is composed of graduate and undergraduate students. It performs regularly with some of America's leading specialists in early music, including collaborations with the Dark Horse Consort, Juilliard 415, and others. It was selected as a finalist for the 2014 American Prize, whose judges stated that Kantorei is "truly outstanding" and has a "finely-measured and delicate balance of voices and a mastery of stylistic performance practice."

The 2019-20 Fine Arts at First Concert Series marks our 27th season of presenting guest artists known locally, nationally, and internationally. All concerts are free, and each is followed by a dessert reception at which you may greet our performers. The series is supported solely by freewill offerings received at performances and by the generous contributions of patrons who provide the foundation for our success. Each season we support a local cause or charitable organization by donating 100% of the proceeds of one concert to the designee. This season's recipient is the Arc of Cumberland and Perry Counties (CPARC) which is a non-profit organization founded more than 60 years ago in Carlisle. Its mission is to empower, inspire, and educate people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, their families, and the community.



# BUMBLE BEE BALLS

Make these yummy treats as a summer snack.  $\frac{1}{2}$  ( $\kappa$ 



- 1 cup peanut butter
- 1½ oz. instant oats
- ¼ cup honey
- ½ cup instant milk powder
- ½ cup dark chocolate chips
- 40 mini chocolate chips
- 20 slivered almonds
- 40 sliced almonds
- Adult help Ok

## What you do:

- 1. In a bowl, mix peanut butter, oats, honey and instant milk powder into dough. If too dry, add more peanut butter or honey.
- 2. Roll dough into 20 long balls. Place them on a cookie sheet and refrigerate.
- 3. Melt the dark chocolate chips and place them in a zippered baggie. Cut a tiny bit off one corner.
- 4. Remove dough from refrigerator. Squeeze thin lines of chocolate as stripes onto the bee bodies.
- 5. Use two mini chocolate chips for eyes, a slivered almond for a stinger and two sliced almonds as wings. Enjoy!


