Covid-19/Worship Update

As we go to press, the CDC is announcing new mask recommendations for areas of the country experiencing substantial or high transmission rates. Governor Wolf has indicated that he is not planning to reinstate a mask mandate or other mitigation measures for Pennsylvania.

Cumberland County's transmission rate is currently "moderate". In addition, the vaccination rate of those attending worship at First Lutheran this summer is close to 100%.

We will continue to maintain socially distanced seating as well as modified communion distribution practices as the surge caused by the delta variant plays out. Please take care of yourselves, encourage friends and neighbors to get vaccinated if they are eligible, and worship at home using our online resources if you are not feeling well. Thank you!


A (temporary) farewell to Pastor Lorenz!
