
A Festival of Lessons and Carols Sunday, December 15, at 4 p.m.

Doing some end-of-year tax planning?

During the past few years, First Lutheran has received several monetary gifts which qualified as "**qualified charitable distributions**" from the donors' IRAs. A "qualified charitable distribution" is a distribution from an IRA owned by an individual age 70¹/₂ or over and paid directly from the IRA to a qualified charity (which First Lutheran is). Please consult with your tax advisor to determine whether you are eligible to make a "qualified charitable distribution" and whether doing so would be advantageous to you. If so, please consider making such a distribution to *Building to Serve All God's Children!*

Information About Building Access

When coming to the church during the week, please enter and exit our building through the door to the new addition, which is unlocked from approximately 7 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, and for evening meetings and rehearsals. For safety and security reasons, the door on the east end of the Christian Education wing remains locked at all times, including Sunday morning, and is to be used as an emergency exit only.

The current door/doorway on the new addition remains a significant challenge. It was not installed with the correct hardware (panic bars, etc.) or the automatic openers needed for full handicap accessibility. Because of the height of the soffit above, we cannot just retrofit the door with openers. We continue to work with our architect and vendors on a solution. The door currently locks with a deadbolt. If, for some reason, you find yourself still in the building after hours, after that door has been locked, <u>please</u> do not unlock and exit through it – there is no way for you to lock the deadbolt behind you and you will leave the building unsecured. Consider this scenario an "emergency" and exit the door at the east end of the Christian Ed wing by the pastor's office. **Thank you for helping to keep our building and all the folks who use it safe and secure!**

The congregation received and approved First Lutheran's 2020 proposed Mission Spending Plan of \$654,800.00 and the proposed Capital Projects Budget of \$70,000.00.
