We are still hoping/planning to hold in person worship on Christmas Eve, Thursday, December 24. Services will be kept to under an hour and will be socially distanced (of course!) All services will include holy communion (wafers only) and candlelighting.



Our tentative schedule:

3 p.m. Spoken liturgy. No congregational singing inside - soloist/small ensemble to provide special music. If the weather cooperates, at the end of worship we will move outside to the High Street Plaza to light candles and sing *Silent Night*. (If the weather does not cooperate, a soloist will sing while we light candles inside.)

5 p.m., 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. Spoken liturgy. The congregation will sing three carols/hymns, including *Silent Night* during candlelighting. Soloist/small ensemble to provide additional music.

From our Sister Parish in El Salvador, Divine Redeemer

Excerpts from Pastor Fernadez' recent letter (*translated by Google Translate, so forgive the grammar*!)

Dear brothers and sisters. Peace and good be with you.

First of all, I want to express our gratitude to

God and to all the people of First Lutheran Church, who have helped us with their financial support. Thanks to their help, we can contribute as a Church, favoring in informal formation people with limited economic resources, both men and women and young people, in the bakery area and also vocational training for women.



These are difficult times because of the COVID-19 pandemic, both in our country and in the world. Our country was already vulnerable and this has exacerbated poverty and hunger.



Through the project, in the face of COVID-19, we have supported the church, in the work of raising awareness of personal self-care, to avoid contagion, in families and the community, the importance of the use of the mask, hygiene protocols, so masks have also been given to people from vulnerable groups; All this effort has had good results, because before it had neglected the people and it was a risk for the families.

The bakery also reached out to the homes of needy families to deliver bread donations, house by

house and we also continued with the trainings with women and bakery.

May God pour out many blessings each and every one and multiply enormously and in great proportions, all the help and support that you give us as a Sister Church.



SUMMARY OF ANNUAL CONGREGATION MEETING

First Lutheran held its 2020 annual meeting on Sunday, November 15, 2020, at 11:30 a.m. in the sanctuary. There were approximately 48 voting members in attendance. Listed below are the actions taken during the meeting.

The minutes of the 2019 annual congregation meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

The congregation elected five members to council. David Fitzsimons, Janelle Hoch, Stephanie Koplitz-Harty, Donald Osborne and Alecia Staley were elected to three-year terms. **The congregation also elected** Kathy Brunie, Caryn Carr and Taylor Miller to serve on the 2021 Nominating Committee.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed and accepted.

The congregation received and approved First Lutheran's 2021 proposed Mission Spending Plan of \$614,700.00.

Prior to approving the proposed Capital Projects Budget, a proposed amendment to the 2021 Capital Projects Budget was received from congregation council to amend the 2021 Capital Projects Budget to allocate the \$10,000.00 proposed for Education Wing Improvements to investigate recurring water penetration in the lower level (rooms 12 and 13). The amendment was approved by the congregation.

The congregation received and approved the amended, proposed Capital Projects Budget of \$21,000.00 in income and \$20,000.00 in expenses.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 11:55 a.m.

Following the August 4 explosion in the port of Beirut we heard of the likely loss of three containers containing thousands of LWR quilts and school, personal care and baby kits.

In October we received this word from LWR: "that upon closer inspection and despite the magnitude of the blast, the seal of the containers containing the quilts and kits had not been broken. The containers had been placed inside a concrete storage building and was surrounded by other shipping containers, protecting the containers enough to even prevent chemical contamination." What wonderful news!!

Thanks to those who donated to the Lutheran World Relief Quilt &Kit Shipping Fund during the month of October. We sent \$1,025 to LWR and will have a "First Lutheran brick" placed in Good Samaritan Plaza in Baltimore.

Please drop off your bags of cookies to the church office by Sunday, December 20. Thank you!


Presentation of Bibles
