
Homeless Remembrance Blanket Project

On Tuesday, December 21, the longest night of the year, First Lutheran will be the host site for a special community event to raise awareness about homelessness.

Organized by the Lower Susquehanna Synod Homelessness & Affordable Housing Task Force and other local advocates, volunteers, and craftspeople, the Homeless Remembrance Blanket Project will cover our High Street Plaza with hundreds of blankets, beginning at 5 p.m.

While plans are still being finalized, the event is also anticipated to include a blessing of the blankets, soup and bread give-away, and ingathering of hats, gloves, and hygiene projects. First Lutheran held its 2021 annual meeting on Sunday, November 14, 2021, at 11:35 p.m. There were approximately 49 voting members in attendance. Listed below are the actions taken during the meeting.

The minutes of the 2020 annual congregation meeting were reviewed and approved as presented.

The congregation elected five members to council. Connie Alexander, Kathleen Hall, Ron Jumper, Karen Longenecker and Lester Reeder were elected to three-year terms. The congregation also elected Donald Grell, Ethel "Pepsi" Simmons and Ashley Zink to serve on the 2022 Nominating Committee.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed and approved.

The congregation received and approved First Lutheran's 2022 proposed Mission Spending Plan of \$561,150 and the proposed Capital Projects Budget of \$30,000.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 12:03 p.m.
