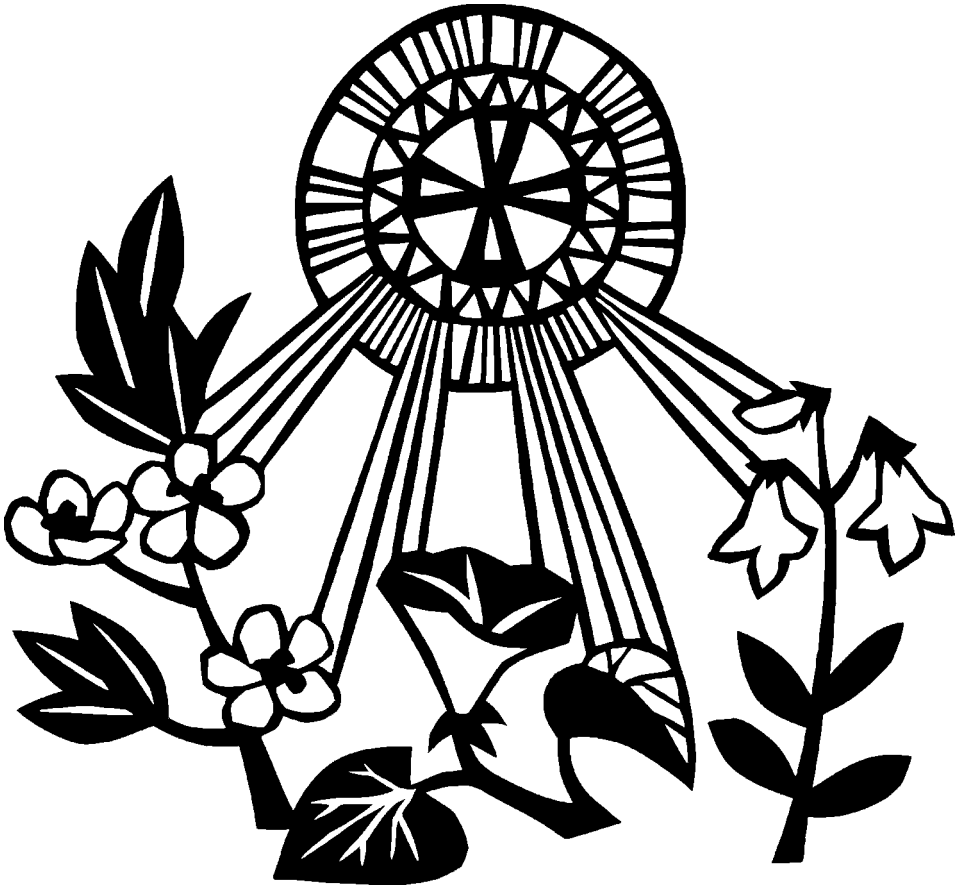

We worship, welcome, witness, teach and serve in the name of Jesus Christ.

Welcome! We are happy you are here as we gather to be forgiven, fed and blessed by God for mission in the world.

We especially welcome our guests – thank you for joining us this morning! Please feel free to ask an usher or a neighbor in your pew if you have any questions about the service or our building. We invite you to provide your name and contact information using one of the blue cards in the pew rack. You may place the card in the offering box or give it to the pastor. Please join us again soon!

We will be celebrating the sacrament of holy communion this morning. We believe that in the bread and wine of holy communion we are offered the gift of Christ's body and blood. We welcome all baptized Christians to our Lord's table, where we are united with the saints of every time and every place.

After the ushers and choir have communed, please come forward via the center aisle. Pick up a glass at the head of the aisle. **Starting at the back left or back right side of the communion rail** (depending on which side of the nave you are sitting) and filling in toward the center, please stand around the rail. After communing (**gluten-free wafers are available upon request**), return to your seat via a side aisle, placing your glass on the empty tray located there. Those not communing are encouraged to come forward for a blessing. **If you have not yet recorded communion during this calendar year**, please complete a communion card (available in the pew rack) and place it in the offering box.

We invite and encourage children of all ages to be present in worship! Children's bulletins and activity bags are available at the High Street and Atrium entrances to the nave. If your little one needs a break during the service, you are welcome to go to our **nursery**. Exit the nave via the door to the Atrium (left front of nave by the baptismal font). Walk through the Atrium to the Christian Education wing. The nursery is the first room on the left. Worship is broadcast over a speaker in the nursery.

Everything you will need for this service, with the exception of the hymns, is included in this bulletin. The hymns are found in the back half of the red Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW). **Large print bulletins and hymns are also available.**

Offering may be placed in the box on the table at the back entrance of the nave. Thank you for your faithfulness in giving!

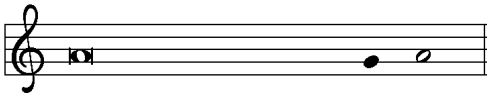

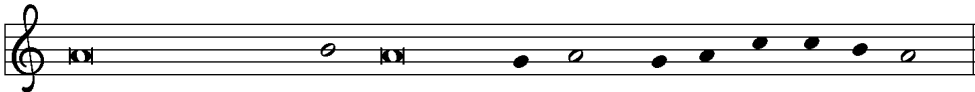

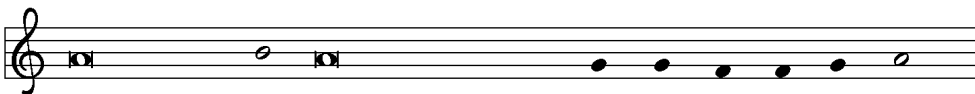

First Reading: Acts 17:22-31

A reading from Acts. Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely spiritual you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served

by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all peoples to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps fumble about for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For ‘In him we live and move and have our being’; as even some of your own poets have said, ‘For we, too, are his offspring.’

“Since we are God’s offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold or silver or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.”

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:13-22

A reading from First Peter. Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and respect. Maintain a good conscience so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight lives, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who

has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.
