CONGREGATION COUNCIL

Under First Lutheran's constitution, duties of Council members include:

- Being a leader in the congregation by assisting in long-range planning, setting goals and priorities, and evaluating activities in light of our mission and goals;
- Overseeing the administration of our congregation, including financial and property matters;
- Maintaining supportive relationships with the Pastor and staff;
- Being examples, individually and corporately, of the life and ministry expected of all baptized persons:
- Promoting a congregational climate of peace and goodwill, and as differences and conflicts arise, endeavoring to foster mutual understanding.

Council meets on the third Tuesday of each month (except July) at 6:30 p.m. Meetings typically run 1-1.5 hours. Council members also serve on one committee as a liaison.

The 2023 Nominating Committee will soon be recruiting nominees to fill five 3-year terms (2024-2026). Please contact Pastor Leber or President David Fitzsimons if you'd like to know more or are open to nomination!

FALL PROPERTY WORK DAY Saturday, October 7, 8:30 a.m.



Fine Arts at First Concert

Sunday, September 17 at 4 p.m.

Our first concert of the 2023-2024 Fine Arts at First Concert Series will feature Daniel Aune on organ. Daniel Aune is the Coordinator of Organ Studies and serves on the faculty at The Peabody Institute of The Johns Hopkins University, the oldest music conservatory in the United States. He is also the Director of Music and Organist at Christ Lutheran Church at the Inner Harbor in Baltimore. At Christ Church he leads the choral and instrumental programs, as well as the *Hafenmusik*: Music by the Harbor concert series.

Daniel holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance from the Eastman School of Music, where he studied with David

Higgs. He has won awards, competitions and numerous accolades for his playing of creative and audience friendly programs. He is a published composer, and is active in the Baltimore Chapter of the AGO and of ALCM.

The concert is free. A freewill offering will be received, and a dessert reception hosted by the Fine Arts Committee will be held following the performance.

October is LWR Ingathering month. Already this year, First Lutheran volunteers have made 100 quilts for LWR, which will be displayed and blessed at worship services on Sunday, October 8, before being delivered to the LWR Warehouse in Maryland. Donations will be accepted to help offset LWR's shipping costs when distributing quilts and kits. Please give generously to help assure that LWR's work continues throughout the world. LWR envelopes will be available at worship on Sunday, October 8; checks should be made payable to "First Lutheran Church" and designated for "LWR Shipping Fund."



First Lutheran's Quilting Ministry

As many of you know, First Lutheran has had an active quilting ministry for decades. Since the evidence of our group is usually once a year on Ingathering Sunday in October (when our pews are draped with about 100 quilts), it might be helpful to know more about this ministry.

Firstly, do you know where these quilts are sent? They are delivered to the Lutheran World Relief Warehouse in New Windsor, Md. From there they are shipped all over the world, including the USA. This past May, Emma Wagner, LWR Congregational Engagement Manager, spoke to us between worship services and explained the multiple uses of quilts in various countries. One surprising use is by school children in unheated schools to sit on and wrap up in. This allows more of the student's body's fuel to be used by the brain for learning, instead of being used to keep warm.

Secondly, did you know that you can be a part of this ministry even if you have no interest in cutting or sewing fabric? Our group relies heavily on donations, both monetary and fabric donations. Without donations the approximate cost of assembling one quilt is \$28.50. Some of our members who are Thrivent members have used their \$250 Action Dollars to purchase flat sheets and quilt batting. If any of you are Thrivent members and would want to use your Action Dollars to help purchase quilting supplies, please contact Linda Fargus or Marsha Lorenz for assistance. Betty Baker, a former quilter, has been purchasing batting (with her Thrivent dollars) for many years. Fabric donations are greatly appreciated as well. The fabrics must be new or gently used cotton. There is a bin for fabric donations outside the church office on the lower level. Thank you in advance for any way you can help this important ministry.

Spooky Saturday October 21, 12 noon - 3 p.m.

In recent years, during Spooky Saturday events, several hundred children and parents have passed through our doors and received candy and information about our congregation. This is a great opportunity to show hospitality to our neighbors.

We will need volunteers to welcome trick-or-treaters and help give out candy on October 21. If you can help for an hour or two between noon and 3 p.m., please let the church office know. If you cannot volunteer on the day of the event, you can still help by bringing a bag of candy to the church office sometime before Friday, October 20. Thank you!



Collection UPDATES



First Lutheran continues to collect aluminum can pull-tabs for the Ronald McDonald House in Hershey. Collection containers are located in the Atrium, the High Street narthex and in the hallway outside the church office.

We have discontinued on-going collections of food items for Project SHARE and personal care items for Safe Harbour. We will advertise periodic collections for specific items (e.g., during Christmas in July) and continue to financially support both of these local organizations (as well as several others) throughout the year.
