## Financing Update



On September 9, 2018, when the congregation voted to move forward with Phase I of *Building to Serve All God's Children*, we had a very successful capital campaign under our belt. The proposed financing plan presented that day took into account the results of that campaign and the historical generosity of the congregation, as well as our history of legacy gifts (trusts and bequests).

On January 17, 2020, the date our construction loan was converted to a twenty-year mortgage, the principal of the loan was only \$1,000,000. That may sound like a big number (and it is!) - but it is much less than the debt we assumed we would be servicing at this time, both when we voted to proceed in September 2018 and even when we were developing our budget for 2020 last fall.

Through your generous giving to the campaign (many folks have pre-paid their three-year commitments) and two large bequests to the congregation received last fall, we have been able to pay architect's and other consulting fees, the cost of project change orders, the first \$178,000 of construction costs (the project was bid at \$1.776 million but our loan through Orrstown Bank was only \$1.6 million) and \$500,000 toward our construction loan in early January. That is simply astounding!

Financing a principal amount of \$1 million instead of the \$1.4 million we expected to finance results in a savings of \$35,000 a year. We have retained enough cash on hand for final payments to our architect and general contractor, once the punch list and the issues with the Atrium front door get resolved. If and when we are able to make additional large payments toward principal, Orrstown Bank is willing to reamortize our mortgage, which will reduce our annual debt service further.

It has been said many times over the past few years, but it is always worth saying again: thank you.

#### **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - January 2020 MEETING**



- +Financial Secretary Hope Miller provided Council with an informative presentation outlining First Lutheran's finances.
- +Pastor Leber provided an update on the conversion of the construction loan to a mortgage. Due to generous bequests and the ongoing support of the congregation, we were able to take the principal of the loan down to \$1,000,000, which results in lower monthly payments than we budgeted for in 2020.
- +Council allocated memorial funds to support Emily Orner's (who is no longer a member of First Lutheran, but grew up here) Guatemala Immersion Semester. Emily is a candidate for Word and Service Ministry at United Lutheran Seminary.
- +Council thanks Pastor Leber, David, Robin, and John for everything they did to make Advent and Christmas worship services go so smoothly and beautifully. We are grateful for their leadership and hard work!




#### **Cantor Adventures!**

Dear First Lutheran Church,

2019 draws to a close and we look back at the year's work with gratitude that we can be a part of such a wonderful journey:

- Continued training of Tanzanian doctors and nurses in Pediatrics and Neonatology
- Caring for hospitalized children with severe malnutrition at Selian Lutheran Hospital
- Hosting residents and medical students from around the world who are choosing to become involved in global health
- Treating dozens of children with chronic bone infections (osteomyelitis) at Plaster House, and watching them walk again
- Doubling our Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) bed capacity and adding a new Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) unit
- Experiencing a 25% increase in NICU admissions, allowing us to provide care to more babies than ever
- 12 neonatology training workshops led across Tanzania among the largest hospitals in the country

Jodi and I are grateful to be on this journey. It has never been easy, but watching our Tanzanian colleagues grow in their abilities as doctors and nurses, and seeing children like Fatuma defeat death and live fills us with a deep sense of purpose and joy.

The choir will perform German music from across the Baroque era, focusing intently on works by Heinrich Schütz, Andreas Hammerschmidt and members of the Bach family, culminating with J.S. Bach's masterwork *Jesu, meine Freude*, BWV 227.

An award-winning chamber choir, it is comprised of students at Westminster Choir College which is one of the world's leading schools of music located in the heart of Princeton, New Jersey. It is conducted by Jay Carter, recognized as a leading interpreter of late Baroque repertoire. The ensemble performs regularly with Juilliard415 and several of America's leading specialists in early music. It was recently recognized as a winner of The American Prize, whose judges stated that the choir is "truly outstanding" and has a "finely-measured and delicate balance of voices, and a mastery of stylistic performance practice."

And don't forget to check the camp bulletin board periodically for other events at our camps!



#### What you need:


- Graham crackers
