Let's help build something!

Yes, it's true...we already are involved in an exciting building project here at the corner of East High and South Bedford streets in Carlisle, Pennsylvania! But our missionaries in Tanzania, Steve and Jodi Swanson, also are working on something important - an expansion of the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) at Arusha Lutheran Medical Center.



The nine-bed expansion, which will double the physical size of the NICU, is expected

to cost approximately \$20,000. Special IV pumps for babies and devices to measure and treat jaundice are needed; funds also are needed to provide housing and food for the nurses from the United States and Canada who travel to Tanzania for 6-12 months to teach and train NICU staff.

As we enter the season after the Epiphany, when we celebrate the revelation of Jesus Christ to the nations, we will be praying for the Swansons and their ministry to, with and among the

(consists of \$600,855 in three-year pledges/one-time gifts and \$34,003 unpledged/"as able" gifts given)


Total pledged and unpledged campaign contributions paid: \$264,607

Construction Update

It's been an exciting month for *Building to Serve All God's Children*! One of our Head Start classes has relocated temporarily to our nursery, while their classroom ceiling is lowered to make room for new ductwork and that ductwork is installed. We discovered a sanitary sewer line during excavation which had to be re-routed. We also discovered several feet of rock where

the elevator is going! After several (loud) days of jackhammering, the rock is gone. As you can see in the picture, the concrete base of the elevator shaft and the elevator sump pit have been poured. We have had a lot of inclement weather this fall, including an early snow storm, and a few "surprises" such as pipes where we did not expect to find pipes - but we <u>are</u> making progress! COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - DECEMBER 2018 MEETING



Council recognized incoming members, Roger Giffin, Nancy Ingram, Lee Leidigh, John Shugars, and Ashley Zink and also outgoing members Connie Alexander, Jered Hock, Debbie

Nickey, Sam Orner, and Rich Wood. According to our constitution, the first day of the new members' three-year terms is January 1. They will be formally installed the second Sunday in January.

It was announced that the new sound system in the sanctuary will be installed the first two weeks of January. This has been budgeted in the past and has been found to offer a marked improvement over the present system.

Note was made that our *Building to Serve* project is advancing. The contractors have relocated every pipe and similar item that needed to be re-routed (there were some surprises in our century-old building!). Weather has permitted the pouring of foundation concrete, and temporary insulation and other heat-related measures have been taken. Also, a number of our members have already fulfilled their three-year commitment to the campaign.

Hope Miller was named Financial Secretary. Hope has been voluntarily filling this position without pay since our previous Financial Secretary resigned. Beginning January 1, this will become an hourly-pay job at the same rate as previously, with no benefits such as retirement or health coverage. The time involved is not to exceed 35 hours per month.

Our Social Ministry and Global Outreach Committee finished out the year by donating \$4,500 of their share of undesignated bequests to local and ELCA-related organizations. It is hoped that early in the year our members will provide additional unbudgeted contributions to the neonatal intensive care unit at Arusha Lutheran Medical Center, the work site of Steve and Jodi Swanson, our missionaries.

The incoming council elected officers for the term beginning January 1, 2019. They are Tali Martin, president, Sarah Niebler, vice president, Lisa Kratzer, treasurer, and John Shugars, secretary.

ADULT FORUM


