Building for Mission

Thanks to all who have made one-time and continuing commitments to our capital campaign (totaling close to \$610,000) and to all who have already begun



making offerings! A couple of updates:The Finance Committee is currently

- The Finance Committee is currently in discussions with both a local commercial bank and the ELCA Mission Investment Fund regarding a loan and will be evaluating the interest rate, amortization period, fees, etc. offered by each lender.
- Three general contractors have expressed intent to bid on the project. Bids are due Friday, June 8. They will be evaluated by the steering committee and architects that weekend, and then interviews with selected candidates will be held Monday, June 11 (and, if necessary, Tuesday, June 12).
- Barring some unexpected event (e.g., bids are significantly out of line with current cost projections, and we need additional time for evaluation), we anticipate that a special congregation meeting will be held on Sunday, June 24, or Sunday, July 1, to vote to move forward with construction and to approve a financing plan. Notice of the meeting will be provided via U.S. mail and at worship services as required by our constitution.

"Ordinary" Time

The past six months have been a whirlwind, haven't they? Since mid-November, we've conducted a feasibility study, refined our master plan, gathered several times as a congregation for presentations and official business, conducted a \$600,000+ capital campaign, developed construction drawings, and begun conversations with lenders and contractors.

Of course, while we've been doing all that work, we have celebrated the seasons of Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter, too!

This past Sunday, Holy Trinity, we moved into "ordinary" time, the season after Pentecost. Except for Sunday, June 24, when we will observe the lesser festival of John the Baptist, from now until the end of October, the paraments will be green, our liturgy will be unadorned by gospel processions or other fanfare, and our scripture readings, from the gospels of Mark and John, will be primarily about Jesus' healings, teachings and miracles.

This season of the church year is a time of renewal and growth, a time for us to catch our breath, to dig deeply into the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to be refreshed for life as God's children. The next few months may be a little quieter than the past months have been (we can only hope!), but, because of God's grace and favor, they will be anything but ordinary! See you in church!

Congregation Council

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - MAY 2018 MEETING

Received treasurer's reports. Offerings for both current expenses and mission outreach are essentially on target. Expenses are slightly below budgeted amounts.

Contributions to the Building for Mission Campaign during April totaled \$123,201. We have exceeded our \$600,000 goal of the Campaign, with commitments and offerings without specific commitments totaling \$609,000 to date.

Updates were provided on work with the architect and contractor-bidders for the building project. Council has tentatively scheduled a special council meeting for the second week of June to determine the date of our congregational meeting on the question of proceeding with the project. Tentative date for our special congregation meeting is either June 24 or July 1.

Two of our Continuing Resolutions were revised. Both date back several decades and changes were in order.

One new Continuing Resolution will combine the Christian Education and Youth Committees into a new Faith Formation Committee. It was also announced that Sunday Church School for children below high-school level will become intergenerational and will follow a model more like our Vacation Bible School.

A second new Continuing Resolution, for the Evangelism Committee, will stress our need to witness, invite, and welcome others to experience Christian community with us.

Council also ratified the Finance Committee's policy regarding unspent trust income. According to this policy, at the end of a calendar year, trust income received above amounts transferred to operating and capital-projects budgets will be moved to the maintenance reserve fund. (It should be noted that offerings in the Martin Luther Room renovation fund are being retained separate from Building for Mission and all other funds.)

It was announced that our youth raised \$500 at their recent car wash. This will be divided equally between the Lutheran Camping Corporation and Camp Koala.

It was obviously not the best weather when this photo documented the groundbreaking for First Lutheran's soon to be new educational wing in the mid 1960s. The white coated individual third from the right (with remarks/prayers? in hand) is Charles Sardeson, First Lutheran's pastor at the time.

Beginning on Memorial Day and extending through Independence Day, First Lutheran will be displaying its World War II era service banner at the back of the sanctuary. Then as now the banner honors those men and women past and present who served (and died) in defense of our nation. The blue stars represent those congregation members who served during World War II, and the gold stars are for the three individuals who gave their lives in that conflict.

Huch'uy Runa (Little important person)

Every weekday morning, 120 elementary school children fill the dining hall at the Help the Children Association School to eat a warm breakfast. While each child has a different story, the children have one thing in common – they all come from an area of extreme poverty in and around the ancient Incan capital city of Cusco, Peru. The school, known locally as Huch'uy Runa, began 31 years ago to meet the basic needs of the children in Cusco. In Quechua, "huch'uy" means little and "runa" means a well-rounded person who contributes to the wellbeing of the community. The two words combined, "huch'uy runa" mean "little important person." And the children of this city carry this identity with pride. The school, with support from ELCA World Hunger, has been able



to change the lives of many "little important person(s)" and their families for more than a decade. Through your gifts, the children of this city receive a primary education, meals and snacks, and training in trade skills that include carpentry, metalwork, pottery and weaving – skills they can use to support themselves and their families in the future. Thanks to your support, the children in Peru are gaining lifelong skills. As one teacher shares, "[It] is like a family trying to equip the children to be able to survive and succeed in life, hoping to build a solid base on which they can stand."

- White cardstock
- Paper towels
- A pen
