

Lent is here – a very busy season in the life of Christian congregations everywhere, and especially so for a liturgical setting. Preparations are well underway for my first Holy Week with you. I admit that I'm excited, but also a bit nervous as some of the services will be completely new to my tradition. This will be my first Easter Vigil service, for example. I am fortunate to work with a great staff and volunteers who can help me with my planning as I do Holy Week at First Lutheran for the first time.

March will also bring my first professional conference during my time here. I will attend the Eastern Division convention of the American Choral Directors Association in Pittsburgh. I confess to being a choral nerd – I've been a part of this organization since high school and I'm a life member. Directors of all types will be there. In addition to church music directors, there are many college professors, teachers of public and private school music programs, and community and professional choir directors. One of the workshops that caught my eye was "An Introvert on the Podium: The Science and Skill to Embrace Your Introverted Self." Another was "Vocal Technique for Choirs – A New Generation of Pedagogy." Some great choirs will be performing including Tenebrae and Kantorei from Westminster Choir College. I want to thank First Lutheran and its members for contributing a substantial portion of the cost of attending.

Before central air conditioning became commonplace, businesses often distributed these palm leaf fans to churches for their use in hot weather. They were a particularly popular advertising giveaway for funeral homes, as this one in our archives indicates. The present day Hoffman Funeral Home is in part a direct descendant of the G. Book Roth Funeral Home, then located more centrally in Carlisle at 169 West High Street.
