# The Season of Lent

The origin of the season of Lent is a bit murky. One theory is that it was the extension of a short period of fasting before Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday into a fast of forty days in remembrance of Jesus' forty days of temptation in the wilderness. In the early church, Lent was also a time to prepare candidates for baptism at Easter.

Whatever its history, Lent offers us 21st century Christians a season of baptismal renewal and of repentance and an opportunity to engage in the Lenten disciplines of giving alms, praying and fasting. Join us on our Lenten pilgrimage!

The season of Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday**, **March 6**. We will offer two worship opportunities that day:

> 12:15 p.m. – spoken Holy Communion with the imposition of ashes7:00 p.m. – sung Holy Communion with the imposition of ashes

Evening prayer will be held at 7 p.m. on Wednesdays (March 13, 20, 27, April 3, 10).

Holy communion will be celebrated on Sundays at 8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.



# FINE ARTS AT FIRST presents CHRISTYAN SEAY In Concert

Lyric tenor CHRISTYAN SEAY will perform in concert at First Lutheran Church on Sunday, March 31, at 3:00 p.m.

Active in recital, oratorio, and opera, he has sung extensively throughout Central PA where he resides, as well as at Weill Recital Hall in New York City and venues abroad in Germany, Poland, and the Czech Republic. In April 2018, he performed in "The Underground Railroad: A Spiritual Journey," featuring operatic soprano, Kathleen Battle. Regionally, he has appeared with the Harrisburg and Lancaster Symphonies and has sung in productions with the Harrisburg, Lancaster, and Philadelphia opera companies. Christyan serves as artistic director of the Capital Area Music Association, a Harrisburg community organization whose emphasis is the music of African-American composers and culture.

His concert, which will include classics and new pieces from various musical genres, will be held as a **Benefit for the St. Barnabas Center for Ministry**, which operates a summer day camp to nurture the spiritual, educational, social, and physical development of Harrisburg's inner city

youth. The center was founded in 1993 as a joint venture of the Central PA Episcopal Diocese and the ELCA Lower Susquehanna Synod. It is located at Christyan's home church, St. Paul's Episcopal in Harrisburg. All proceeds raised will be donated to support the camp's operational expenses.

The concert is free. A freewill offering will be received, and a dessert reception will be held by the Fine Arts Committee following the performance.
