Worship and Music News

If you have worshipped here regularly over the past six years, you have experienced the joy of singing service music and hymns led by David Erickson. David has served as our interim minister of music twice, from November 2013 to June 2014 and then again from August 2016 to June 2017. In July 2018, he became our part-time cantor, under a year-to-year agreement.

David announced last fall that he would not be able to continue serving as our cantor after May 31, 2020. As many of you know, David is owner and financial planner at Erickson Financial in Chambersburg. He is also a devoted husband and father and involved in other community organizations. We, of course, wanted to honor his wish to step back from his responsibilities at First Lutheran, and so, after Christmas, the Personnel Committee began the search for a new musician. However, we also began exploring whether adding another musician to share the workload might enable David to continue being part of our worship and music ministry team.





We are delighted to announce that Michelle DiBona Trefren will be joining First Lutheran's staff as associate cantor, effective June 1. David will continue as our cantor and our primary organist. Michelle will play for worship twelve Sundays a year. David and Michelle will share leadership of the Chancel Choir, and Michelle will be responsible for Bell Choir and will be involved in children's music on Sunday mornings.

Michelle received her Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from Syracuse University and a Master of Music in Conducting from Westminster Choir College, Rider University. She has served a number of congregations and community choirs in the mid-Atlantic region and in Japan. She will be assisting David with worship and covering a few rehearsals and Sunday mornings this spring, prior to becoming "official" on June 1.

Please take a moment to thank David for his past and continuing service and to welcome Michelle and her family (husband, Will, and children, Laurel and Reed) to our congregation's ministry. We are very blessed!
